Theme	<p>Torrential rain starting from 16 July 2015 in the Northern part of Myanmar and Cyclone Komen that landfall Bangladesh has triggered severe and widespread floods and landslides across twelve states and regions in Myanmar. As of 9th August 2015, the National Natural Disaster Management Committee reported that affected population accounted for 1,016,167 while 211,709 households were displaced, and death toll reached 99.</p> <p>As of 9th August, floods caused over 1.29 million acres of farm land inundated and 687,200 acres were damaged and 15199 houses were totally destroyed. Railways, motor roads, bridges, schools, health facilities and monasteries were damaged.</p> <p>As of 5 August, 1,387 schools across nine flood affected areas remain closed, and children’s access to education is temporarily disrupted.</p> <p>Provision of roofing sheets for the immediate repair of damaged schools is a priority. Replacing teaching learning materials which was lost or damaged is also critical.</p> <p>Education Sector partners distribute school and student kits and the authorities are targeting some 2,700 flood-affected school children in these areas with exercise books, pencils, and ball pens.</p> <p>In Mon and Shan states, distribution of essential learning supplies for about 500 children, who have lost their stationeries and school items, has started. In Rakhine, partners are repairing damaged temporary learning</p>

	<p>spaces in camps</p> <p>Some townships in Yangon division were also affected but the response naturally pay attention to severely affected areas. Alumni Association of IATSS Forum Myanmar aims to provide student kits to primary school in Taik Kyi township.</p> <p>The main purpose of the activity is to provide necessary student kits for the primary students who lost their school materials followed by the Gashuku and games which can give message about leadership.</p>
Priority Issue	The students affected by the floods lost their school materials and facing difficulties to resume their education while their family assets are also destroyed. It is not an easy effort for the parents at the grass root level who lost their house, properties and livelihoods to rehabilitate their children's education materials.
Goal	The project aims to contribute to the rehabilitation of the education for the primary school students in Taik Kyi township. The message given through Gashku and games will introduce the leadership concept to the primary school students who can importantly contribute to the national development of Myanmar in the future. Even though the big contribution to the reconstruction of the school will not be met by the project, the distribution of the student kits and awareness raising on leadership will definitely contribute to the immediate needs of the students to quickly recover in their education.
Objective(s)	The project will fill the essential gaps for flood affected students so that they can continue their education. The project will reach the primary school in Taik Kyi township in Yangon Division in which the other respondents are less interested than the severely affected areas in other States and Regions.
