Priority Issue:	The destructions brought about by the series of typhoons that swept our country in 2013 and just recently by monsoon rains resulted in damage of schools in Luzon with estimated cost at about billions and affected about millions school children in both elementary and secondary schools. In Pangasinan, Philippines 316 barangays remained flooded after a heavy rainfall due to a southwest monsoon enhanced by a tropical storm, Josie, last 2018. The Philippines is no stranger to violent storms and flood annually, with this said, it is important that Filipinos should prepare for disasters before, during, and after such event. Proper education and training are needed to prepare the citizens to act to reduce the risk of loss of life from future hazardous event.
Goal:	The goal of this project is to facilitate the transfer of knowledge in providing flood safety tips, seminars, and training with information needed to reduce risk and hazard; to promote hazard or disaster awareness; and prepare young citizens to act during disastrous events.
